3. One entry per category per member.
4. Write your name, category, name of flower/vegetable/fruit/herb and variety (if known) on the entry ticket provided at the event.
5. Adhere to the schedule for each event on the following page.
6. We kindly ask that members refrain from entering invasive species.

June Show

Section A: Flowers

1. Peony, any cultivar, 1 bloom
2. Iris, any cultivar, 1 stalk
3. Clematis - any cultivar, 1 stem
4. Allium - any cultivar, 1 stem
5. Hosta – any cultivar or size, 3 leaves
6. Any other Flower, not listed, 3 blooms/stems

Section B: Indoor Plants

Should be owned for a minimum of 3 months

1. Any plant grown for blooms
2. Any plant grown for foliage

Section C: Floral Arrangements

1. Good enough to eat: an arrangement incorporating flowers, vegetables and herbs
2. Petite Wonder: a miniature arrangement (no more than 6 inches in all directions)





September Show

Class A: Vegetables

1. Cherry Tomatoes, 3 fruits, calyx attached
2. Leafy Greens (e.g., Kale, Chard, etc.), 3 stems, displayed in a clear container
3. Any other Vegetable, not listed

Class B: Flowers

1. Cosmos, 3 blooms
2. Zinnia, 3 blooms
3. Dahlia - any cultivar, 1 bloom
4. Rose - any cultivar, 1 spray/bloom
5. Sedum - 3 stems
6. Any other Annual, not listed, 3
7. Any other Perennial, not listed, 3

Class C: Indoor Plants

Must have been owned for a minimum of 3 months

1. Plant grown for blooms
2. Plant grown for foliage

Class D: Floral Arrangements

1. Outside the Box: an arrangement in an unusual container
2. Wild at Heart: an arrangement using only native species and wildflowers
